EMPOWERING OUR ALUMNAE COMMUNITY

PROGRAM OVERVIEW







As we embark on a year where traditional happy hours, reunions, and regional events are unlikely to take place in person, alumnae offices across the country need to find innovative ways to keep alumnae engaged and connected to their school communities. Close Up and Hockaday's Institute for Social Impact have partnered to provide innovative alumnae programming that is relevant, impactful and helps to strengthen alumnae's connection to their classmates and the school community during this challenging time. Designed as a three-part series, *Empowering Our Alumnae Community*, will help alumnae navigate challenging conversations about political and social issues, and will create a robust network of alumnae leaders looking to make an impact locally, nationally, and as part of a girls school collective.

Program Sessions -

Each session will be 60-minutes in length and take plan on zoom:

<u>Session 1: Navigating Challenging Conversations</u> - How can we navigate difficult conversations about social and political issues as a community of engaged alumnae? What strategies and approaches lead to productive engagement across differences of identity and ideology? In this session, we will practice skills of deliberation and listening, share our ideas about challenging policy proposals, and reflect on the difficulties of talking to friends, family, and co-workers about issues facing our country and community.

<u>Session 2: Women in Politics</u> - In celebration of the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment, and while recognizing that we have yet to achieve the goals of equality expressed in that amendment, we will hear from a panel of trailblazing women in local and national politics. We will explore the progress that women have made and are making while looking at the challenges that still lie ahead.

<u>Session 3: Advancing our Legacy of Social Impact</u> - By leveraging our collective voices as a strong girls school network, alumnae will come together to consider ways to have a meaningful impact on our communities, our schools, and future generations of women leaders. During this unpredictable and difficult time, we know alumnae are juggling many different responsibilities and are still eager to contribute -- find easy ways to make an impact while strengthening your connection to your classmates and school community!
