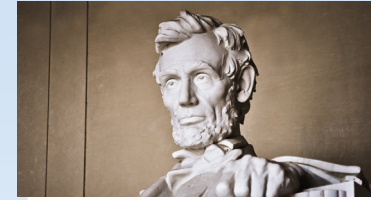


# CLOSE UP MIDDLE SCHOOL - PROGRAM FOR NEW AMERICANS
