Join high school students from across the country for the National Youth Impact Summit to deliberate on pressing national challenges and create informed, lasting solutions! This one-week program equips you with the tools and knowledge to become a catalyst for change in your community.

You will research and understand the characteristics and causes of pressing national issues, consider the value of deliberation, develop a cohesive Youth Agenda for Action, and meet with public officials to advocate for your proposals. Led by Close Up faculty, you will also participate in a facilitation training and work with your peers on a real-word deliberative democracy project.

Program Details ——

In this week-long program, led by Close Up faculty, students will:

- Network with a diverse group of their peers from across the country; •
- Hear inspiring stories from young activists on strategies and models of advocacy and activism; •
- Deepen their understanding of national issues and root causes; •
- Participate in a program-wide deliberation led by Stanford's Deliberative Democracy Lab; •
- Work in small groups to create meaningful solutions and craft policy proposals; and •
- Present their national proposals to decision-makers on Capitol Hill.
