EMPOWERING FEMALE VOICES: PRESIDENT'S FIRST 100 DAYS

PROGRAM OVERVIEW







As a young woman, how can you stay active, involved, and engaged after the election? Which issues were most important to you? How can you make an impact on those issues at the local, state, or federal level?

Empowering Female Voices: President's First 100 Days will give girls an opportunity to take part in this fast-moving period of national conversation and action. As students examine the agenda of the president, they will share their own priorities and come to understand the ways in which ordinary people can influence the nation's roadmap for the future. By engaging girls from different backgrounds in meaningful dialogue and action, we aim to help them develop empathy for the perspectives of others and build the skills and confidence needed to empower a generation of female change-makers.

PROGRAM SESSIONS -

During six online sessions led by Close Up instructors, students will meet, interact, and deliberate with a diverse group of peers from other parts of the country. Each 75-minute session will encourage students to consider multiple perspectives and deepen their understanding of public policy and develop policy proposals to impact change.

Session 1 – Building an Inclusive Community and Staying Engaged after the Election: In order to create a respectful space for discussing complex issues, Close Up will facilitate dialogue between students from different backgrounds to build a cohesive online community. Students will then examine the agenda and goals of the new administration and Congress, and consider how people can continue to stay engaged after the election.

Session 2 – Identifying a Pressing National Issue that Matters to You: Students will form policy committees based on interests and deliberate about the issues within that priority area. As students deliberate they will consider how values such as justice, equity, and liberty shape current debates and policies. Possible issue areas include: Educational Equity, Environmental Justice, Economic Inequality, and Criminal Justice.

Session 3 – Developing Policy Proposals: After exploring a range of ideas and values through deliberation, students will craft policy statements that identify new legislation or executive actions to advance their agendas.

Session 4 – Hearing from Experts: Students will hear from female leaders who are making a difference in their selected policy to help shape and strengthen proposals.

Session 5 – Advocating for Your Policy: After hearing from experts, students will focus on effective advocacy strategies as they continue to refine their proposals and make presentations compelling.

Session 6 – Summit Convention: Students will present their proposals to other students on program and work together to decide which proposals will be included in the Empowering Female Voices: Agenda for Change.

After completing the program, students will be invited to participate in our special Empowering Female Voices — Civic Action Symposium to share selected policy proposals with a panel of female politicians and changemakers for feedback and advice.

Eligibility & Special Rate ---

The program is intended for girls in grades 9-12 and can be integrated into a current government or civics course, advisory program, club, or leadership development opportunity like student council. During this time of social distancing, the series can also replace a capstone project, experiential learning trip, or community service opportunity.
