




DELIBERATIVE DIALOGUE

Deliberation is a common theme in Close Up programming, as participants listen to different perspectives, weigh competing arguments, and work together toward consensus and collaborative solutions to policy issues. Through our NextGen Roundtable series of summits, PD, and classroom materials, students learn and practice the skills of deliberation and increase their sense of efficacy and mutual respect in the process.

After engaging in deliberation, students' satisfaction with U.S. democracy significantly increased.
