It focuses on three domains: **(1) Analyzing Political and Social Issues; (2) Communicating Across Difference; and (3) Digital Citizenship and Media Literacy.** Within each domain are competencies and rubrics that outline learner progressions, as well as supporting curriculum and assessments to guide and evaluate students' development as they build mastery. Progress is tracked through a Learning Record hosted by Mastery Transcript Consortium (MTC), an ETS company.
